After graduation, I worked as a freelance musician in the area, and solidified my decision to continue my career as a professional musician.

I decided that there was still a lot of work that I wanted to do to improve my technique and musicianship, so I auditioned and was accepted into the program. After a long process, I finished my Doctorate of Musical Arts in Double Bass Performance in 2012.

It was during this time, that I started performing with the West Valley Symphony. I actually do not remember exactly what year I started performing with the WVS, but I believe it has been about 15 years.
