
IN THEIR OWN WORDS Get to Know the WVS Musicians Alex Manners, Horn



Tell us a little about yourself:

My name is Alex Manners, and I am currently second horn with the West Valley Symphony. I am originally from Lee's Summit, Missouri, which is just outside Kansas City. I did my undergraduate degree at Truman State University in Kirksville, Missouri, and I worked as a high school band director in Missouri for six years after college. At that point, I decided I wanted a new challenge, and decided to go back to school to work on graduate degrees in French horn. I completed my masters in horn performance at the University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign and moved to Arizona in 2014 to do my Doctorate in Musical Arts at ASU.



I am an elementary band director in the Dysart Unified School District, but in addition to this, I work as an adjunct horn instructor at both Glendale Community College and at GCU, and I work with the horns at Mountain Ridge High School. I live in Surprise with my wife Daniela and our dog Sydney, and we welcomed our first child, Jacob, in January 2024.



I'm a pretty active freelance musician across the Valley, and currently also serve as second horn in Symphony of the Southwest, play in the Phoenix Brass Collective, and I have performed with a wide array of other groups (including subbing with the Phoenix Symphony, the Tucson Symphony, Arizona Broadway Theatre) and for many churches in town.

I do. I have two younger brothers. They both live in Missouri and work in the financial industry.
